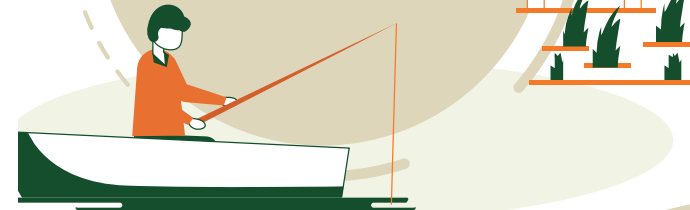

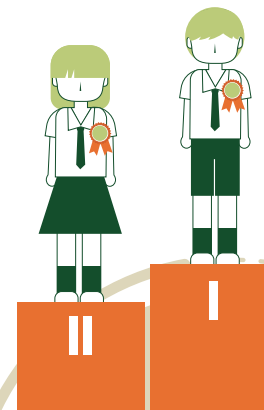

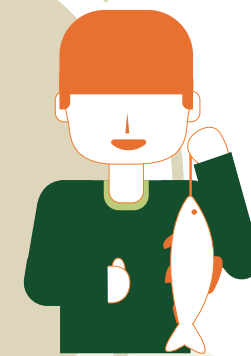

Overview of Cirebon Power

Since its establishment, Cirebon Power has envisioned to pioneer cleaner energy solutions using technological advances to preserve the environment and to ensure a better life for all by the power we produce.

Cirebon Power has a 1x660 MW Supercritical coal-fired power plant in the Cirebon coastal area. Recently, we have been developing another new unit, which is an Ultra-Supercritical coal-fired power plant with the capacity of 1x1000MW. As part of the Indonesian Government 35,000 MW Power Plant Program, our new unit is proof of our contribution for a better Indonesia.



PT Cirebon Electric Power (CEP)

Established in 2007, CEP is a multi-national consortium company consisting of several companies such as Marubeni Corporation (Japan), Indika Energy (Indonesia), Korea Midland Power (South Korea), and Samtan (South Korea). The group of energy powerhouse joined forces

and built its first unit of 1x660 MW in Kanci Kulon village, West Java. Starting in July 2012, the power plant began its operation and has been producing 5 TWh of electricity per year to the Java-Madura-Bali (JAMALI) grid.



Cirebon Energi Prasarana (CEPR)

The multi-national consortium (Marubeni Corporation, Indika Energy, Korea Midland Power, and Samtan) behind the success of our first unit began a new journey by adding Japan's JERA to develop the 1x1,000MW expansion project.

Not only bigger and stronger than the previous one, this new unit utilizes advanced Ultra-Supercritical technology that enables us to produce more energy in a more efficient way. The expansion unit is expected to operate in 2021.

Cirebon Power Community Development Program

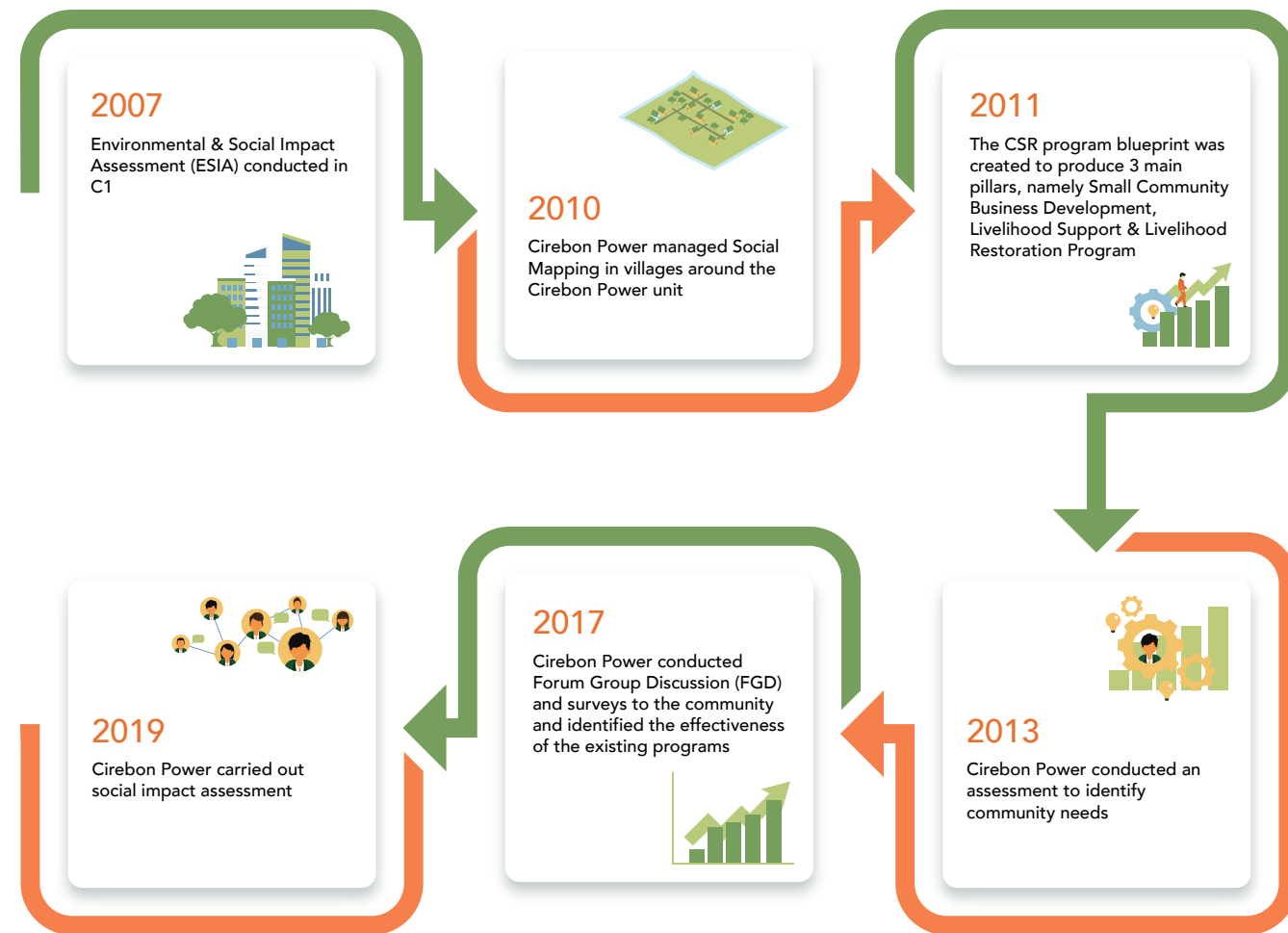
Cirebon Power is committed to grow and develop with the community. We fulfill our social responsibility by integrating 3 main pillars, namely Small Community Business Development, Livelihood Support & Livelihood Restoration Program, supported by the Vocational Training Center where we provide training programs for students to join the electric power industry.



Since 2010, we have been conducting social mapping within the framework of supporting the development of the Cirebon community, especially people who live around our unit. Together with universities in Cirebon and our external consultant, we have actively conducted several processes to develop our community, from identifying the needs of our community based on surveys and studies, creating planning programs, implementing the programs, providing assistance to the community, and conducting evaluations and monitoring of the program's implementation.

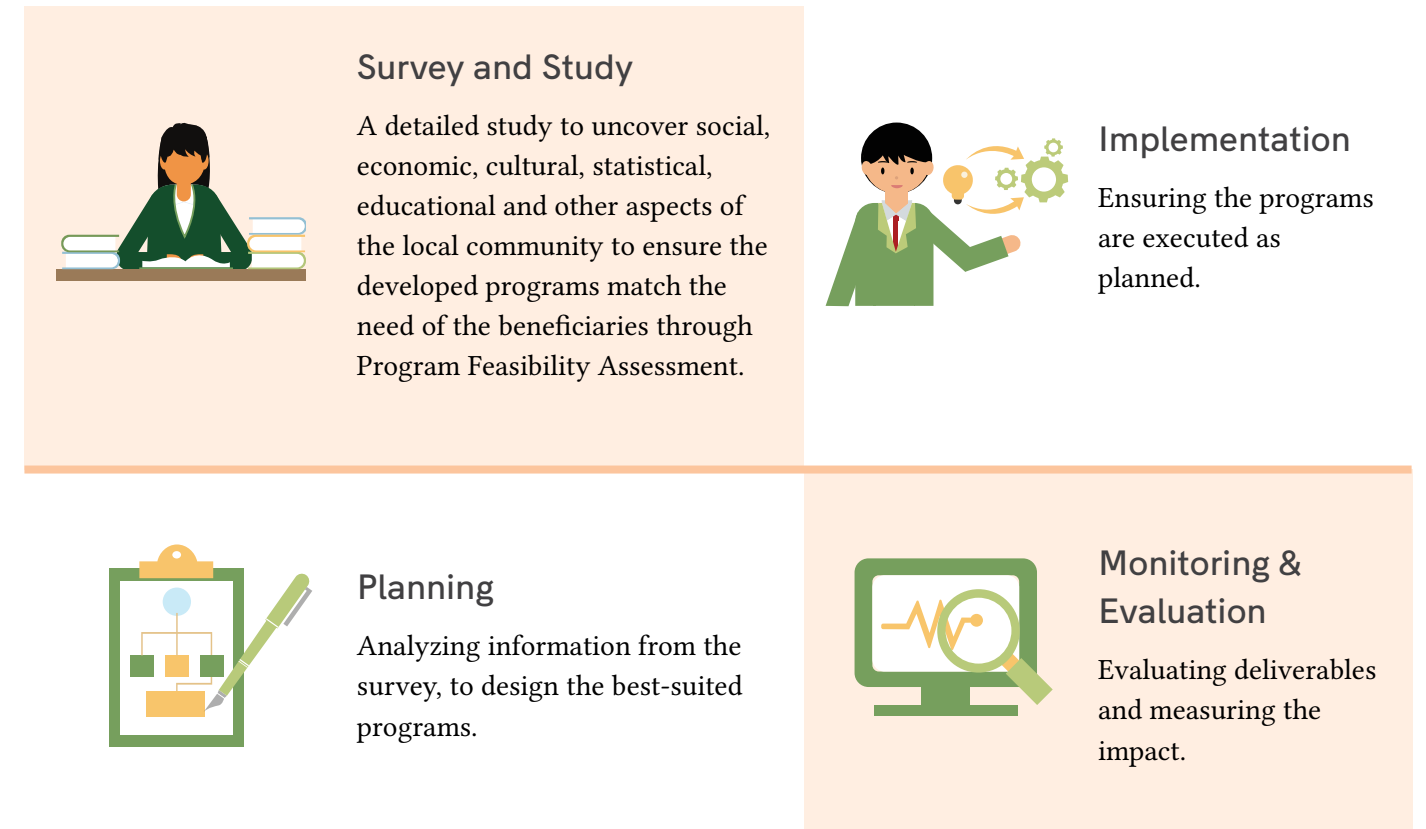
CSR Program Strategy

Over the years, Cirebon City experienced rapid industrial development. This development can be seen from the data on the number of Small and Medium Industries (IKM), which has now reached nearly 14,200 businesses. Cirebon power sees this development as an opportunity to improve the capacity of the community as well as their life's quality.

To optimize the implementation of CSR programs, Cirebon Power has developed a long term strategic planning (period 2018 - 2022). This plan is made and adjusted to the problems / needs of the community and is very useful as a guide to achieve these goals. In 2019, we collaborated with a local university to monitor and evaluate Rumah Terasi Kanci and the Vocational Training Center.



Our strategy for optimizing the implementation of CSR programs includes:



In 2019, we conducted a social mapping to understand and obtain a complete picture of the social conditions of local communities e.g. problems, potentials, and needs, especially those related to sustainable livelihoods. This activity is important because every community has different social conditions.

We visit and discuss directly with community leaders and groups to find out what the community needs. Not only that, we also monitor program evaluations to assess the extent to which these programs have an impact on the community. Cirebon Power's commitment to fight poverty is recognized by the public.

In 2019, Cirebon Power received Gold Award for Batik Pesisir Kanci Program at the Indonesia Sustainable Development Goals Award (ISDA) 2019 – Corporate Social Responsibility based on SNI ISO 26000: 2013 for its contribution in achieving No. 1 Sustainable Development Goals - No Poverty.





Along its journey, several community development programs have gradual improvement through the mentorships provided in the community. As a reference, indicators are needed to show that the running programs are based on the planned and expected results. The indicators of our program are:

Community development is not just about responsibility. This is a form of commitment to be able to make a real contribution and we want to ensure that our community will be able to improve their quality of life with the programs we have initiated.

Over the years, Cirebon Power has collaborated with government, villages, and universities in Cirebon to listen more and improve their livelihood. In line with the Sustainable Development Goals no. 1 (End Poverty in All Its Forms Everywhere), 5 (Achieve Gender Equality and Empower All



Women), and 8 (Promoted Sustained, Inclusive and Sustainable Economic Growth), we initiated to develop sustainable programs to improve community welfare. Community business program is a development program aimed at those who have small businesses and want to develop it.

In 2019, we support the community by providing loan funds for group capital, guiding them, and providing training to develop their capacity. We also provide economic opportunities for women to earn daily income while preserving their traditional heritage.

We support our community to improve product's quality, such as improving the product's package by using modern design and hygienic processing, increasing the quality of standardization and service improvement, developing production & marketing skills to increase sales and market expansion, and creating more product variations. These efforts were made to increase the selling value of products and also increase the income of SMEs.

Rumah Terasi Kanci

“Rumah Terasi is a very useful program. In the future, we hope Cirebon Power will continue to provide assistance to improve marketing strategies, add technical training, especially for more modern packaging. Now, Rumah Terasi is able to run the program independently.”

Cirebon is a city that has a variety of interesting and unique cultures and culinary traditions, one of which is shrimp paste. Kanci has always been known as a shrimp paste producer. The shrimp paste originates from rebon (small shrimp), which is then processed with water and pounded hence it can last almost a year. As a form of Cirebon Power’s commitment in empowering the economy of Kanci, we took the initiative to create “Rumah Terasi Kanci”. Not only that, Cirebon Power also provides assistance and guidance in collaboration with local universities in improving the quality and standardization of production, packaging and expanding product marketing.

In 2019, Cirebon Power continued to focus on assisting Rumah Terasi Kanci in producing products that comply with applicable health standards. We have conducted hygienic production, packaging, finance and marketing training. This year, Rumah Terasi Kanci succeeded in producing not only natural shrimp paste but also producing chips containing terasi. The product has received halal certification from Majelis Ulama Indonesia of West Java Province. Promotions were conducted to increase the selling value of products by participating in Bazar on Cooperation Days at Regent office yard for a three days event.

Total income during 2019:
Rp. 87,382,000.

It is hoped that this product will not only be sold in Cirebon, but also to other regions.



Cirebon Batik Kanci Group

Batik is one of Indonesia’s cultural heritage that is recognized by the world and designated by UNESCO since October 2, 2009. This heritage has become a sense of pride for all people in Indonesia. To preserve this, Cirebon Power formed the Cirebon Batik Kanci Group by providing training for the local community who have zero knowledge about making batik. The training has been continuously delivered from creating patterns on fabric, canting, filling (isen), and pelorotan. Cirebon Power also facilitated workshops as a place for them to work and provided them 1 unit of batik shop.



Throughout 2019, the group reached several achievements. Currently, 50% of group members were able to create a proper batik tulis. This group also produced its main products namely Batik Pesisir Kanci and developed other products including batik cetak by using natural color to produce environmentally friendly products. The group also cooperated with some official batik shops since there was a high demand for batik tulis products.

Total income during 2019:
Rp. 29,270,000.

Some innovations were made by the batik group, for example using plants as the basic materials such as mangoes and mangroves.

Rejeki Mundu Fish Crackers & Steamed Fish Group



Mundu Pesisir Village is a fishing village located in the eastern region.

To increase the fishermen's family income, Cirebon Power initiated capacity development programs for a group of women in the households by adding value to the fish and crabs into crackers. The program provides training and equipment to this group, which consists of 17 members.

In 2019, a number of training programs were conducted by Cirebon Power to develop their capacity. The training covers some practical skills such as:



Managing journal transactions



Weight scaling



Finance training

As a result, this group succeeded in developing a new product such as bandeng presto and bandeng crackers. This product was made because of the high demand from the market. This group also has no difficulty in selling their products since they have basic skills of trading.

Cooking and Catering Group (Pawon Mimi)

Pawon Mimi Cooking Group was formed by Cirebon Power to assist the empowerment of housewives in Kanci Village. Since its establishment, this group has begun to receive many orders. Cirebon Power provides them with cooking training, cooking and catering utensils, and also 1 unit located in Cirebon Power Park. Because of its strategic location, many people stop by to taste the food made by Pawon Mimi. Besides selling food, Pawon Mimi also serves catering orders for wedding celebrations and other events.

In 2019, the Mimi Pawon Cooking Group was registered and received a permit from the Pangan Industri Rumah Tangga (PIRT) issued by the SME Health Service, Cirebon Regency. Cirebon Power also collaborated with Cirebon Polytechnic Tourism in providing new grilling techniques training.

Ratu Cirebon Makeup Artist Group



This group originated in 2014 through inaugural training held by Cirebon Power in collaboration with the District Manpower Service (Disnakertrans) Training Center (BLK). After training, the group is able to manage the group independently because some members have good business skills.

Cirebon Power provides training for regional bridal makeup and provides equipment such as clothes and equipment for regional makeup to be used as assets for the group. This group is expected to develop together and be able to meet the expectations of the user community

and become a land for additional income members of this group.

In 2019, to further optimize the skills/capacities of members in doing makeup, Cirebon Power provided more modern MUA training. Therefore this year, the Ratu Cirebon Makeup Group has been able to serve makeup for weddings, school events such as Kartini Day celebrations and graduation. This group also rents out various wedding decorations such as gebyok, stage, chairs etc.

Total income during 2019:
Rp. 9,120,000.

Klambi Cirebon Sewing Group

Other economic empowerment programs is a sewing group, consisting of several villages, namely: Mundu, Kanci Kemis, Karang Tanggung and Waruduwur. In 2015, we provided them with basic sewing training. Cirebon Power gave access to capital through the procurement of sewing equipment placed in Taman Cirebon. Now, the active members were skilled in sewing clothes and began to receive some orders, both from Cirebon Power and the surrounding community. They also generated income from making goodie bags, jackets, laptop bags and clothes.

During 2019, several training sessions were conducted to upgrade their capability. There was a positive spirit from the members to be able to sew various types of products. It is expected that the participants will be able to improve their ability so they can work professionally. This group often gets orders that are still dominated by the surrounding community and Cirebon Power #2 contractors to create uniforms.

Total income during 2019:
Rp. 6,720,000.

In line with SDG such as poverty alleviation to support the people's livelihoods and economy, Cirebon Power strives to empower the economic livelihood of the community. We believe that economic development goes alongside with the welfare of the community and thus, by empowering the economy of the community, we can optimise the livelihood of the community.



A large number of fishing and agricultural communities are one of the focus of livelihood support programs conducted by Cirebon Power. Most residents work in various jobs ranging from farming, fishermen, and cricket farmers.

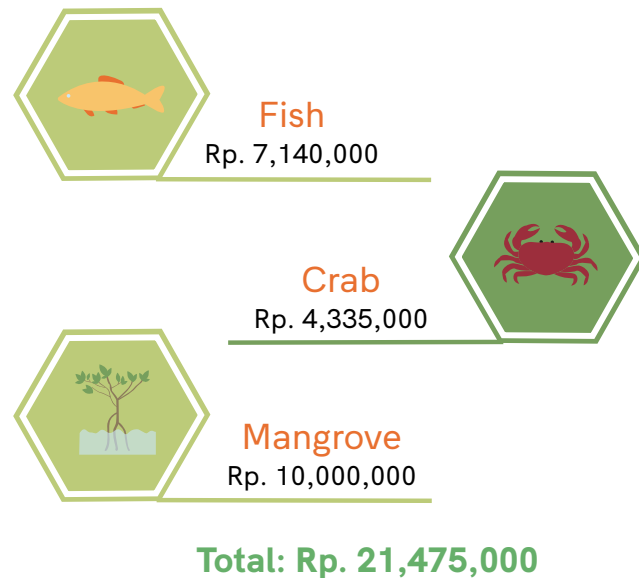


This group is made up of 50 coastal fishermen sailing using small boats with a capacity of 1-2 individuals. Cirebon Power supports the group by funding fishing equipment and aiding in mangrove planting activities.

Another service we provide is financial management coaching by having them set up petty cash on their behalf which will later be used to cover their fishing activities and basic needs.

Cirebon Power also facilitates the group to set up crab cultivation development in the mangrove area as alternate livelihood. This is a new effort and also a priority to develop in the long term. We continue facilitating fishing net and gear and planting 3,000 mangrove and maintenance in Kanci River Estuary as CP commitment to environment preservation. Fishermen are provided with a chance for an additional income through this activity.

Berkah Mandiri Cricket Farmers

Kanci area is a perfect location for business in cricket farming. The crickets can be used as bird feed and will bring more income to the community when cultivated well.

Groups of cricket breeders were formed with Cirebon Power providing capital to start their business. We hope the community will be able to raise their resources and have more

cricket eggs & feed so farmers can get the optimum profit.

At the same time, Cirebon Power continues to provide assistance through a collaboration with the Agricultural and Animal Husbandry Office of Cirebon Regency to improve production. We also conducted a comparative study and benchmarking to success cricket farmer in

Majalengka Jawa Barat.

This year, the group continues farming through hatchery eggs and crickets growing. The farmers became a routine supplier to bird sellers and bird farms.

Total income during 2019: Rp. 18,000,000.

Perkumpulan Petani Pemakai Air (P3A) Farmers Group

Farmers in Kanci Kulon now have to rely on water pumps to irrigate their rice fields because irrigation from the previous reservoir is damaged. Cirebon Power helped them to normalize the irrigation system and facilitate the provision of 300-meter plastic hose in 2019 to supply water to the irrigation channels. The irrigation channels will be used for 160-hectare of paddy fields. The farmer groups help in maintaining the equipment throughout the year.



Mundu Fisherman Forum



The fishermen's forum, that consists of four coastal villages, namely Bandengan, Citemu, Mundu Pesisir and Waruduwur, provides services for coal barges that unload their cargo at the dock in the Cirebon Power PLTU project. Other facilities include picking up and transporting crews that choose to go ashore, as well as having logistical negotiating conditions. There are about 17-19 barges parked each month, and fishermen are ready for 24-hour work. Cirebon Power offers local fishermen groups this opportunity to get additional income besides fishing.



Throughout 2019, Cirebon Power continues to supply food stock needs and transportation for coal barge & tugboat crews through this forum. Furthermore, we conducted Sea Safety training, in collaboration with Marine Police and the Marine/Fishery Agency of Cirebon Regency to properly equip fishermen with the necessary safety skills needed in their occupation.

Total income during 2019:
Rp. 121,950,000.

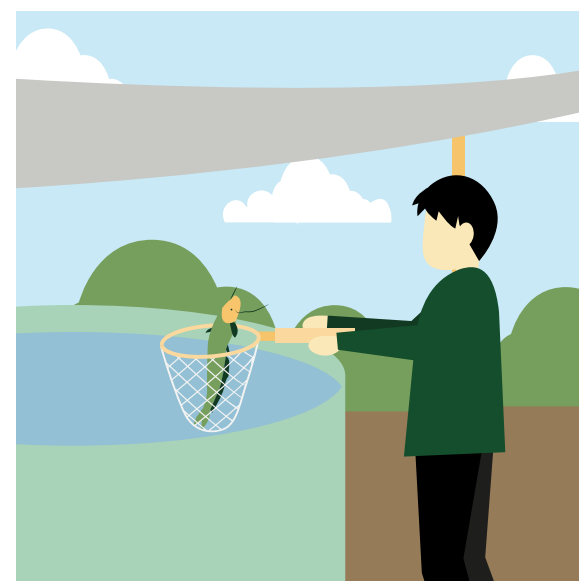


Masyarakat Pecinta Lele “Mas Pele” Catfish Breeders

In Kanci Kulon Village, Fish farming is one of the potential sources of income, and catfish farming is famous for its high potential for success. In Kanci Kulon, West Java, 31 residents have been invited since April 2017 to learn about fish farming. In 2018, the first fish harvest failed due to factors surrounding water issues and juvenile fish quality. However, the 2019 harvest brought dividends as the 2019 harvest proved successful.

To support the catfish farmer, we implemented an innovation program to make alternate feeds made from crab shells, shrimp leftovers (supply from Fishermen group) and rice bran to reduce cost of purchasing processed mill feed factories. This trial was found to reduce feed cost by 35%.

Total income during 2019:
Rp. 4,841,000.



“Gopes” Wood Crafting

In 2019 Cirebon Power established a new group based on potential existing local sources of wood craftsmen. We identified that these local craftsmen could be taught to create miniature boats from wood. We see them as having the necessary core skill to start this entrepreneurship idea and thus, we started the wood crafting group.

Cirebon Power facilitates the group by conducting workshop renovation, providing the necessary equipment, and conducting product trials for souvenirs. The product is a traditional boat characteristic of Cirebon as part of local wisdom. Moreover, we utilize wood waste from Unit #1 Power Plant as material for making boat miniatures thus enhancing the economic value as well as implementing waste utilisation.

Rp. 11,400,000.

With the influx of development occurring, the socioeconomic conditions of the community can change over time. This causes changes in the lifestyle as well as sources of income and livelihood. For example, salt farmers who live in the villages of Waruduwur, Kanci, and Kanci Kulon can no longer work on their salt farms.



Cirebon Power sees the changes in socioeconomic condition as an opportunity to open up new avenues and restore livelihoods lost during modern development. We set up programs as a way to encourage the community to innovate new ideas and develop new skills towards restoring their livelihood.

Mitra Dhuafa Cooperative

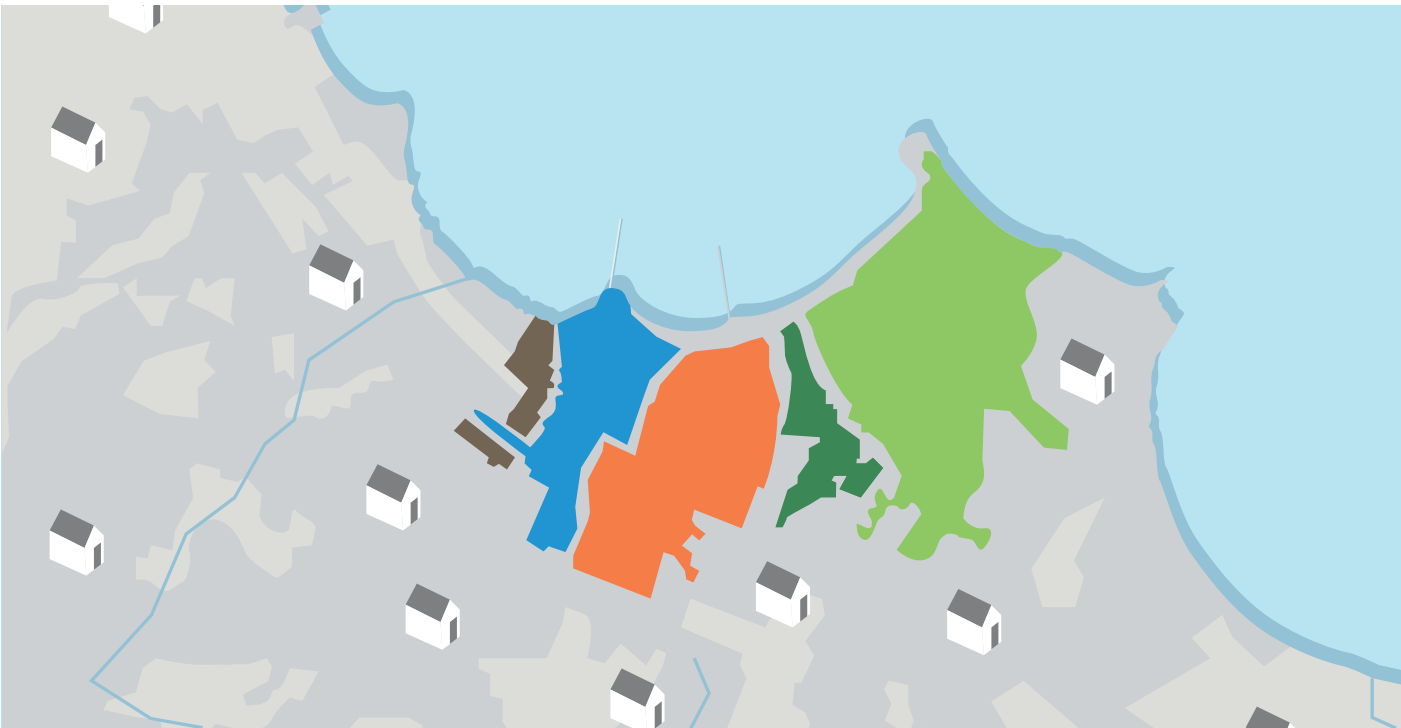


In cooperation with Mitra Duaafa, our microfinance scheme has adopted Grameen Bank Concept which has proven successful in microfinancing. The housewives of the community are the main targets, which are then put into groups of five to ten members. Each group shall apply for a loan collectively and shall be liable for the outstanding amount of the loan if one of its members has defaulted the loan. They will have responsibility for the loan in this model and it will motivate them to develop their business further.



This funding scheme provides support for micro-businesses and requires only basic paperwork, such as a copy of the husband's and wife's identification cards and family identification cards. To be eligible for funding, they are required to attend workshops,

which include topics such as financial management, entrepreneurship & motivation, and capacity building. There are weekly meetings to promote the repayment of loans and establish relationships between members.

Vocational Training Center

Cirebon Power has successfully accommodated the local communities with skills development by offering vocational training services since 2013. Those programs were then upgraded in early 2017 through Vocational Training Center growth.



Our main goal for this Training Center is to enrich the vocational skills of talented individuals in nearby villages (Citemu, Waruduwur, Mundu, Kanci Kulon, Kanci Wetan, Kanci Kemis, Bandengan, Astarajapura, Kandawaru, Pangenan) which could be further used in their entrepreneurship ventures. These skills include: operation and maintenance, welding, scaffolding fitter, and other workforces.





For operation and maintenance vocational training (OM), training materials are delivered by an internal team from Cirebon Power, and from Korea Midland Power (KOMIPO), and will be certified by the Association of Indonesian Electrical Engineering Experts (IATKI). For other training, such as welding, fitter, refrigeration systems, training materials delivered by external parties such as the Work Training Center (BLK), or from other parties.

Some of the training is 240 hours long (refrigeration engineering), while others are 160 hours long(3G welding techniques), each in accordance to the required competencies.

At the end of their training, an assessment will be conducted to assess their skills. After passing the exam, participants will also receive a certificate from BLK and the National Professional Certification Agency (BSNP). Most of the training graduates have worked on ongoing PLTU construction projects, such as being a welder, fitter, scaffolder and helper.

Throughout 2019, we had 128 students enrolled in our vocational classes and participated in the project construction of PLTU #2.

Health Programs

Fishermen Insurance

Most people in Cirebon are working as a fisherman. In fact, fishermen often face life-threatening hazards which are vessel casualties, extreme weather, and diving incidents.

Since 2011, Cirebon Power has initiated an insurance program for fishermen. We collaborate with West Java Regional Police, Jasa Raharja Insurance and Coastal Fishermen Group to provide accidental death and dismemberment insurance for the fishermen. Since 2018, the fishermen's insurance program has been adopted as a national Polairud program, aiming to improve the livelihood of the fishermen. In 2019, with effective cooperation, the number of fishermen covered by this insurance reached 21,000 people in 10 coastal villages.

Free Medical Check-Up

Community health has always been our focus in carrying out CSR activities. Together with Karang Taruna, Family Welfare Empowerment (PKK), and Community Health Center, we provide free medical check-up and treatments for the community in surrounding villages. This program is aimed at all levels of society and has always received a positive response since it was first held in 2009. In 2019, 10,000 people have received the benefits of this program.

Integrated Health Service Center

Since 2010, Cirebon Power has been working with PKK and Community Health Center to improve nutrition for infants, carry out supplementary feeding (PMT) for toddlers, and do capacity building for the operational cadres in 44 Integrated Service Posts (Posyandu). Those 44 Posyandu are scattered in 8 villages around the Cirebon Power operational plant. Not only toddlers are the focus of Posyandu activities, guidance for parents, especially mothers, is also carried out. 220 cadres worked together to provide PMT to 3,400 toddlers in 2019. Cirebon Power also invited 44 selected cadres to do a comparative study with the output of Posyandu management and administrative planning.

Ambulance Service

More than half the villagers do not have private vehicles thus they often find it difficult to reach the health care institution when emergency medical matters occur. This issue triggered the procurement of this ambulance. Cirebon Power provides ambulance service to villages around operational plants. It is hoped that with the ambulance cars, the local community can be facilitated. These three cars are serving people who need help reaching the medical facilities and ready to be used 24 hours a day. In 2019, there were 712 beneficiaries in 6 villages utilizing ambulance service. Cirebon Power worked together with the village officers to appoint volunteers to operate the ambulances cars.



Educational Programs

Award for Outstanding Students

Education is the most important thing in human life. As an appreciation, Cirebon Power gives financial rewards with stationary and support them to buy schools stationaries for 1,200 elementary students who were ranked top 10 in schools. The selected students came from 20 elementary schools nearby our plants. Rewards are given so that students can improve their achievements and stimulate their enthusiasm to continue their education to a higher level.

Study Tour

Cirebon Power accommodates high school and university students with a visit to our plant. This year, we invited 650 students to get a glimpse of our activities in technological innovations, environmental management, and social programs.

Students are actively encouraged to understand the role that they could play in similar power plant projects and make a positive contribution to the surrounding economy if they remain focused on their education.

Saba Sekolah

We have taken effort into supporting education development through Saba Sekolah. Initiated in 2018, Saba Sekolah is a set of educational programs to help the local communities improve their educational level and boost the students' motivation. We dedicate this program to build and improve youth's awareness and knowledge on social and environmental issues.

Cirebon Power's experts and practitioners shared their expertise and insights in the fields of technical, business management, human resource management, environmental management and community development program management. Program has implemented in several educational institutions, including: SMKN 1 Cirebon, SMK Samudra, and Swadaya Gunung Jati University in Cirebon.



Reading Club and Literacy at Citemu Village

We continuously seek effort to amplify the importance of reading to students, especially primary school students. Together with the Fishermen Community, Regional Police of West Java and Gelemaca Teachers Community, we established a Reading Club in Citemu Village. This Reading Club is fully managed by volunteers consisting of teachers from nearby primary schools under the supervision of Gelemaca Community. The children are assisted by volunteers to complete post-reading activities by writing in their journals about the book they read, the number of finished pages, book summaries, book authors, book producers, and their personal opinions. Cirebon Power also provides a Library Management Training program to build the volunteers' capacity.



In 2019, the reading park and library facilities have succeeded in attracting children from nearby coastal villages to read regularly and join several literacy activities that were conducted. There were 30 until 40 children every day paying a visit to the library, with more visitors on weekends. Almost 200 children attended the Literacy Festival to increase their knowledge and interest in reading/reviewing books. There were also outbound activities where children could interact with each other and grind their creativity.

Cirebon Power Park

To provide more public spaces to the communities, our company has introduced Cirebon Power Park which was built over 5 hectares of land in 2018. In 2019, a library was set up inside the park as an educational place for the local communities. Routine maintenance is continuously held and a renewal is done in some areas to be used as facilities for Small Medium Enterprises (SMEs).



Community Environmental Forum

In 2019, we continued to support the Community Environmental Forum by facilitating the renovation of the seedling nursery and planted 500 protective trees in Kanci Village. The nursery of the seed took place in a new area of 1,000 sqm behind Cirebon Power Park.

The Community Environmental Forum supervised the fisherman group in cultivating and restoring the mangrove. In July, the Community installed a paranet in the new trees nursery location independently. The Forum also supervised events that were organized by Cirebon #2. In addition, they planted 20,000 Akasia mangium trees beside the perimeter fence in the Cirebon #2.

Mangrove Cultivation and Restoration

One of the main focuses of our social program is the environment where the community resides. Cirebon is located on the northern coast of Java island. When hundreds of people live on the coastal, mangroves protect shorelines from damaging storm and hurricane winds, waves, and floods. Mangroves also help prevent erosion by stabilizing sediments with their tangled root systems. They maintain water quality and clarity, filtering pollutants and trapping sediments originating from land.

In 2019, 2,000 mangroves were planted in Kanci shoreland. The trees were obtained from mangrove nursery cultivation that was run by the fisherman group. The objective of this program is to restore the mangrove area while preparing the area for crab cultivation and increase biodiversity. We worked together with the Community Environmental Forum and Jelombang Selar Fisherman Group to preserve the mangrove ecosystem.



Waste Management

Cirebon Power has several environmental programs of which the impacts can be directly felt by the community around the plant. One of them is facilitating waste containers to Kanci Kulon and Waruduwur whose village officers are now taking care of the containers. In 2019, the waste containers were still being utilized by the community.

This year, we held the Cirebon Power Volleyball Cup II in Astanajapura sub-district. This program also aims to develop young talents in volleyball and to strengthen the ties between Cirebon Power and the City.

A number of religious activities were held in 2019. We appreciate not only culture but also the community beliefs. This was reflected by inviting hundreds of community members from 9 villages to have iftar together in the vocational building.



Sharing “Qurban” during Eid al-Adha

In 2019, as a part of our spiritual support and also coinciding with the Eid al-Adha feast, Cirebon Power participated in Eid al-Adha by sharing sacrificed animals (Qurban) such as cattle and goats to the public in 9 villages.
